Communities respond to domestic and sexual violence

The eight clips on this DVD all show men taking action to prevent domestic violence, rape and HIV/AIDS.

This DVD is designed to be used with groups of people. It works well if used as part of the One Man Can Action Kit, but it also works on its own.

Each clip has a set of questions to spark discussion about the themes shown. These questions should encourage viewers to reflect on the kinds of things done by men to address domestic and sexual violence, and to make connections within their own lives and relationships.

The clips present a selection of different situations and issues including:

- Community mobilisation.
- The use of theatre and music to challenge gender-based violence.
- Personal stories of individual men committed to developing healthy, equitable relationships with women.
- Building a human rights culture.
- Understanding culture and tradition.
